

**The Wolfpack Experience

When scheduling a visit to NC State University, you have **three options**:

1. **An information session** at the Joyner Visitor Center designed for prospective students
2. **A bus tour** of Centennial Campus, home to the College of Engineering and the College of Textiles, as well as more than 130 business and government partners. Centennial is an innovative collaborative community of business, industry and scholars.
3. **A walking tour** of main campus

When you enter the building you will be greeted by friendly staff who will welcome you and provide an information packet for your session. If you are planning to do a walking tour of main campus without a bus tour, you will be given a campus map and parking pass for the Reynolds Coliseum Parking deck on main campus near the Talley Student Center, which marks the beginning point for the campus tour. If you are taking the Centennial Campus bus tour, it will take you to Talley for the walking tour, so no parking pass will be necessary.

The 45-minute information session highlights the University, including its unique location in the Capital City of Raleigh, NC, academic programs within the 10 colleges, the admission application and review process, housing, dining, safety, transportation, student life, study abroad, honors and scholars programs, and college sports.	
10:30-11:00: Bus tour of Centennial campus or explore on your own	2:30-3:00: Bus tour of Centennial Campus or explore on your own
This time is allotted for you to catch the bus tour through Centennial campus. Or you can explore the information kiosks and displays and talk with University Ambassadors and staff at the Visitor Center, shop at the bookstore, check out Carmichael Gym or the Gregg Museum of Art, or grab a bite to eat before your walking tour of campus which will begin at the Talley Student Center on Main Campus.	
11:15-12:15: Walking tour of campus	3:15-4:15: Walking tour of campus
The walking tour is a great opportunity to talk with University Ambassadors about their experience at NC State from the students' perspective. During the tour you will enter a sample residence hall room, stroll through the Free Expression Tunnel and the Brickyard, view the library and visit a sampling of academic buildings.
