Please be advised that all concentrations for International Studies require a 300-level foreign language course. All foreign language coursework is currently listed in the appropriate NC State semester but due to the number of specialized sequential courses NC State recommends that students work with their advisor and transfer advisor to determine their optimal path. Students taking a foreign language at NC State will need to take the Foreign Language Placement test prior to enrolling in Fall classes.
